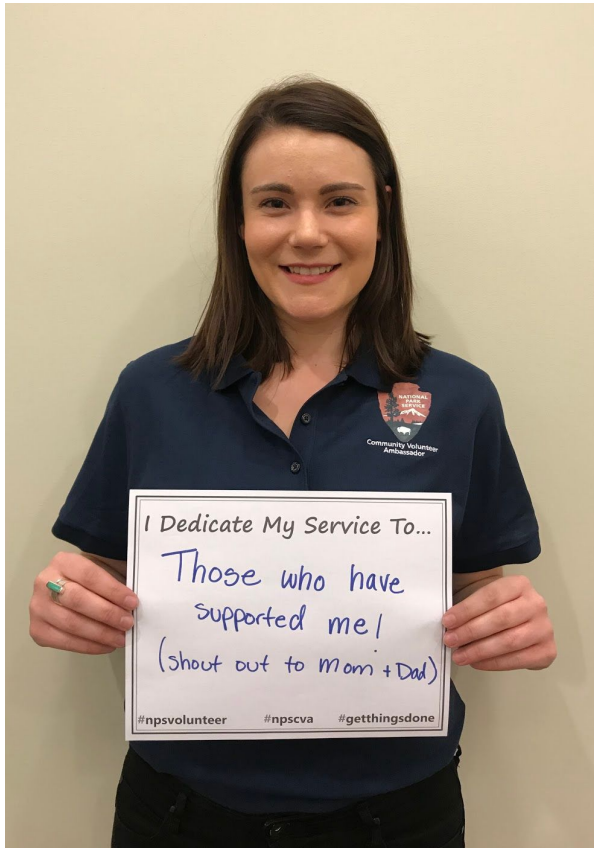


Klondike Gold Rush National Historical Park – Seattle (WA)
